ACADEMICS AND CAMPUS AFFAIRS




ATO and scholarship have been synonymous through the years. Our chapter and national place emphasis on grades, scholarship and campus involvement. There are numerous awards and scholarships offered by ATO including Fellowship and Intern scholarships, the Thomas Arckle Clarke Award and the Stewart D. Daniels Scholarship. During the past two semesters our chapter has had over 10 brothers who were 5.0 point scholars. Our house grade point average is consistently above the men's university and fraternity grade point average.

Awards are annually given for the outstanding pledge, senior and most valuable athlete.

ATO continues to be involved in campus affairs and the community. This past year, for social services, we have helped the Salvation Army, The American Cancer Society, the Y.M.C.A. and the Epilepsy Foundation in fund raising activities.





ATHLETICS

ATO is a dominant force in athletics at both the intramural and varsity level. In '73-74 and '74-75 we won the Fraternity IM All Point Sport trophy. In each of those years we won with record point totals. Although the IM Point trophy competition has been abolished in the '75-76 season, ATO hasn't stopped its winning ways. This past year we have won Fraternity Golf, Volleyball, Basketball and Pledge Football. In the U. of I. leagues we won basketball and finished 2nd in football. All our teams made the playoffs, in addition to the waterpolo and swimming teams finishing second.

In university athletics, ATO is well represented. We have brothers who are currently on the baseball, football, track, golf and swimming teams. Among them have been Tom Hicks, of the Chicago Bears, Mark Peterson, of the Kansas City Chiefs and freshman Jim Shanel, Big Ten Champion in the 100 yard breaststroke.


We also have 3 annual social events each year: Pledge Dance, Sweetheart Dance, and Outhouse Scramble Picnic.
