

Increase in Undergraduate Membership, a Special Homecoming Dedication, and Impending Capital Campaign Headline ATO's Achievements

As the fall semester draws to a close and the holidays quickly approach, we reflect on Gamma Zeta's progress. Since our last newsletter, there have been a number of positive developments at the House and there are multiple reminders to pass along. Below are some of the highlights:

- Taking the Hardware The Alpha Tau Omega National Fraternity hosted its 77th ATO Congress this past summer in Austin, Texas. Gamma Zeta was the recipient of a number of awards, including its 19th True Merit Award, Excellence in Financial Management, and Excellence in Campus Involvement/Leadership Development. Congratulations to the undergraduates, former President, Mike Keeley, and his House Committee team members!
- Undergraduate Update House Corporation welcomed the new House Committee members into office on Homecoming weekend. Led by President Kyle Gillen, Vice President Jimmy Skuros and Treasurer Aaron Zaluzec, the house continues to build positive momentum and maintain strong participation levels among all actives. This is clearly evidenced by the increase in live-in members and the growth in the pledge class size. There are now over 80 members living in the house, up from 60 in the previous semester. Maintaining this 100% capacity level will be essential

to securing our financial flexibility in the coming years. Furthermore, Gamma Zeta successfully closed the fall pledge class with 29 new pledges, ranking in the top five on campus.

House goals for this academic year, as determined by the new House Committee, include (i) a top 10 academic ranking among fraternities, (ii) a 95% or better financial collections rate, (iii) a minimum of 75 live-in members at all times, and (iv) the University's only marquee campus-wide philanthropy event to be launched. On a personal note, we'd like to thank former President Mike Keeley and his management team for their service over the past year.

The Ties That Bind: Bill Barry '77 Is Thankful for the Relationships He Formed in ATO

How One Brother Helped Lead Bill to a Life-Long Career He Loves

Bill Barry '77 grew up in the small town of Taylorsville, IL. He got his first introduction to ATO when Bill Ganey '75, who was two years ahead of him in school, invited him and a friend (Tom) to stay at the ATO house for a weekend. They went to an Illinois basketball game and got to know several brothers, including Gerry Kostelny '75 and Bob Mathias '74.

Bill took us to a bar, "Second Chance." It was my first time at a fraternity. We stayed up late night at the house, and the next day I signed up.

Bill was only a high school senior at the time, but in those days it was permissible to pledge even if you weren't a college freshman. "Joking around, the guys said Tom was the one they wanted, but I pledged and he didn't, so they were stuck with me," Bill chuckled.

Bill was an accounting major at Illinois. He and two other brothers, **Dave Seiler** '77 and **Rich Clausing** '77, leaned on each other for support. "We spent the bulk of our four years studying together," stated Bill. But despite the heavy workload, they made sure there was plenty of time to join in the fraternity's festivities.

"My favorite memories are the intramural sports," Bill recalled. "I was our intramural chairman for a couple of years. We won three consecutive intramural basketball championships."

His favorite memory was winning Dooley's touch football championship.

Bill, known to his brothers as "BB," immersed himself in the camaraderie he found at the house.

"I lived at the house all four years I was there, which was kind of unusual. But I loved staying there. My meals were cooked for me and I studied quite a bit."

There was one room at the house that stood out above the rest because it was built by Mark Greenleaf. Rooms at the house were allotted to the brothers first by class, then by GPA. Bill had a high GPA, so he was always one of the first to get his pick of rooms.

Bill Brennan '78 half-jokingly suggested they room together, and the two ended-up claiming the desirable room.

"It may have been the best grades he [Bill Brennan] ever got, and the most fun I ever had with a roommate," Bill recalled. "We were complete opposites."

After graduation, Bill worked at Pricewaterhouse as a senior auditor with fellow ATO **Mike Faber**. But it was another ATO that brought about his transition to commercial real estate. Bill heard that **Gerry Kostelny** '75, who was the head of the Lincoln Property Company, was looking for a Chicago office controller. Bill jumped at the chance and began a new career. "I'm amazed how many ATOs are involved in the real estate business," Bill observed.


Bill was hired at Draper and Kramer, another real estate company, in 1989. He has been there ever since and is now the senior vice president and heads the commercial mortgage financial group.

Over the years, Bill has maintained strong ties with the fraternity. He has been the chairman of the March of Dimes Sports Awards dinner for the last 19 years, an event that draws about 25 to 30 ATOs every year. He attends the ATO golf outing that is run by some of the actives, which raises money for the Matt Heldman Scholarship Fund, and he meets ATOs for cocktails at a bar in downtown Chicago over Christmas. His class has a reunion every five years, the next one will be in 2007.

"Really, one guy, **Dane Luhrsen** '77, keeps us informed of all the ATO alumni events," Bill commented. "His many emails make sure we all show up. Without Dane, we would not get together as much."

Bill has one son, Jeff, who is a senior at the University of Virginia and is an accounting major. "He'll probably work at one of the Big Four firms," he stated proudly.

Bill has been more than happy with his career. He will continue working in real estate for a few more years before thinking about retiring. Bill is grateful for where his profession has taken him, and it was Gerry Kostelny that made it all possible. "I owe Gerry Kostelny a big thank you for where I am today."


